A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

As we head into the "most wonderful time of the year", we are busy with decorating and getting ready for the holidays at the Vial House. There will be many festive events and activities for all age groups. Follow us on social media, check our website and newsletter calendar for the latest on what we have planned!

We have been able to complete critical infrastructure projects with your help and contributions. We have made extensive outside repairs on the Vial House prior to the much needed painting. A new side porch fits the house just perfectly and a new side door replaces one that was broken and rotted. Inside, UV protective film has been installed on the interior of the first floor windows to preserve flooring and furnishings. Like all old homes and museums, maintenance and improvements will be ongoing. This year we will soon reach out with our End of Year Campaign. Items on the near horizon are electrical upgrades, a new water heater, outdoor lighting & decorative fencing for safety on our busy corner.

Recent explorations took us to the Blue Island Historical Society, the Hegeler-Carus Mansion, and homes in the Pullman neighborhood on the National Register and part of the National Parks system. I am committed to us learning from other organizations to expand our wealth of information and ideas from their experiences as well as sharing ours with them.

Our vision for the future includes expanding the museum with an addition that will serve our mission, community and region for many years to come. History is being made every day and the Samuel Vial House and Museum needs the space to document and preserve our past as well as our future. The next several years will be exciting indeed!

MEET A VIAL HOUSE HERO~ MARK LAMBIN



Mark has been a longtime volunteer, supporter & "doer" with LGAHS. Mark has an enviable "green thumb" and in addition to tending to the gardens at his home, he has volunteered his time to work on the landscaping at the Vial House. One of many contributions

Mark has made is the creation of our Butterfly Garden. Mark planted the recommended types of plants and flowers and the garden was submitted to Monarch Watch, a nonprofit organization that works to protect monarch habitat. The Vial House Butterfly Garden has been certified by Monarch Watch and registered as an official Butterfly Waystation. It adds to the beauty of the Vial House in the summer & in the winter, the installation of "icicle" lights that brilliantly illuminate the Vial House through the holidays is a gift from Mark to LGAHS every year. It truly makes the Season bright! Thank you for all you do Mark!

NUTS & BOLTS

Over the past year we have shared updates on the projects going on at the Vial House through this column. We want our patrons, donors and members to know how the funds so generously donated to the LGAHS are being allocated. In a past newsletter, we informed you that the Vial House was in danger of approaching a "tipping point", that is, a point where the work that needed to be done would be cost prohibitive leaving the House in a precarious position. We are relieved to tell you we are well beyond the tipping point and moving toward the future with plans that will continue to enhance what we bring to the community!

The Building & Grounds Committee has achieved remarkable things this year. The Committee went over the entire House in meticulous detail to determine the work that needed to be done. Dave Knecht, Mike Henderson & Jim Peterson have spent countless hours orchestrating the work that has taken place. Dave 's expertise in historic homes & his generosity in offsetting the cost of his expert contractors has allowed LGAHS to get much father along on projects both large and small. As an architect, Mike's expertise in drawing plans and prioritizing the work has been invaluable and Jim has acted as the project manager coordinating the bidding processes, reviewing contracts and scheduling contractors.

Katherine Padgett, President of LGAHS, has been the driving force in achieving these preservation efforts. She brings her considerable knowledge, tireless efforts and a belief in what's possible to her work for the LGAHS and will continue to move the agenda forward!.

Niego Construction & main carpenter, Ricardo Roman, took on the urgent project of replacing the side porch of the Vial House. The porch was torn off and completely rebuild. The craftmanship of the work resulted in a beautiful addition providing convenient access to the House during outdoor events. What was an eyesore is now an attractive structure that enhances the appearance and the functionality of the Vial House.

The crew from Ed Mattingly Painting began the painting project by doing extensive restoration repairs on the exterior. As the painting nears completion, the Vial House has been transformed by a vibrant, period appropriate color scheme based on recommendations from a professional historic colors consultant from the University of Michigan.

With these major exterior projects completed, the Vial House is now a fitting gateway to the La Grange Historic District. As the saying goes, "it takes a village" and sincere thanks to our village!
